# > Agenda No. 4.01: Welcome

Vice Prin. Dr. Priyamvada Tokekar, Member Secretary formally welcomed the esteemed members to the 4<sup>th</sup> Academic Council Meeting. With the permission of the Chair the committee took up for discussion all the points mentioned in the Agenda.

Agenda No. 4.02: To read and confirm Minutes of the previous meeting.

The Minutes of the third Academic Council meeting held on Saturday,17<sup>th</sup> September 2022was presented by Principal Dr.(Mrs.) Suchitra Naik and sought the confirmation of the same from the committee. The agenda was unanimously approved by the esteemed members.

### Resolution No.1

RESOLVED that the minutes of the 4<sup>th</sup>Academic Council Meeting held on Saturday, 17<sup>th</sup> September 2022 are approved by the Governing Body.

Agenda No. 4.03: To provide an overview of Board of Studies meetings. Vice Prin. Subhash Shinde informed the members about the BoS meetings conducted by various departments and an update was given on the agenda of the BoS which included the revision of TY-UG syllabus and PG -Part II syllabus for academic year 2023-24. The members were also briefed about the redrafting of POS's & CO's according to Blooms Taxonomy so that the mapping of syllabus and evaluation pattern are in accordance to NEP structure and recommendation. A round up of the business transacted in Board of Examination and Evaluation, Finance Committee and Academic Council was apprised for the confirmation of the members and was duly approved.

#### Resolution No.2

RESOLVED that the final approval to the changes in curriculum, POS's and CO's made by various Board of Studies (BoS) are approved by the Academic Council.

> Agenda No. 4.04: To approve the TYBA Programme with three papers of Philosophy and three papers of Psychology from the academic year 2023-24.

Prin. Dr. Suchitra Naik informed that the college has been offering 6 papers in Philosophy and 6 papers Psychology in the past years. This year there is a proposal to introduce three papers of Philosophy and three papers of Psychology at TYBA which would be beneficial for students to select Philosophy or Psychology for their Masters Programme which would further be in tune with the New Education Policy. The proposal was approved by CADr. Vishnu Kanhere and seconded by Dr. Sameer Kulkarni.

RESOLVED that the Academic Council approves the proposal to introduce the TYBA Programme with three papers of Philosophy and three papers of Psychology from the academic year 2023-24.

> Agenda No. 4.05: To update about Introduction of new proposed under Graduate & Post Graduate Programmes from AY 2023-2024.

Prin. Dr. Suchitra Naik informed the respected members of the Academic Council the proposal to introduce the following Post Graduate programmes from the academic year 2023-24:

- 1. Masters of Arts (MA) in Political Science
- 2. Masters of Arts (MA) in Marathi
- 3. Masters in Vocational (M.Voc) in sales & Marketing Management
- 4. UG Programme BCom in International Accounting (ibcom)

A detailed briefing on the scope and purpose of these new programmes was provided by the Principal. The members opined that these programmes would go a long way in providing more employment opportunities to the youth. Dr.Sameer Kulkarni inquired if the component of Digital Marketing is incorporated in the syllabus of M.Voc.In reply to that, Dr.Archana Prabhudesai, Coordinator of B.Voc courses stated that Digital Marketing is included in the syllabus at the Graduation level and is also proposed for the Masters. CA Dr.Vishnu Kanhere opined that Internship at UG level would enhance job opportunities hence subjects like Sales and Marketing could be incorporated in the syllabus.

After due discussion and deliberations the members unanimously approved the proposal.

- Divyangjan (Star students) Cell titled, 'Atulya' was established on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2022. The intension behind establishment of this cell is to mobilise physically challenged students and to update them about welfare scheme of the Government for them. In all 58 students from Junior and Degree are part of this group
- In order to develop Khadi Culture the teachers are requested to wear Khadi on every Saturday. On this Republic Day teachers were given Khadi Jacket as a part of this

- initiative. One Charakha training workshop was organised for the students in which 15 students participating.
- Counselling cell has started Consultancy services in the year 2022-23 to provide mental
  health services to outside clients. So far 8 clients have taken benefit of this service.
  Consultancy services include personal counselling for various mental health concerns as
  well as guidance for overall growth and betterment.
   Similarly Legal Consultancy service is also initiated by the college
- Under the umbrella of Social Responsibility NSS Unit organised 10 days Community Involvement Programme at adopted Village, Takipathar wherein 20 Departments and 6 Committees participated.

The members discussed the proposal and granted their approval for the same.

  Principal Dr.Suchitra Naik informed the members about the Examination Compendium prepared by the college which gives detailed information about the rules and regulations of the Exams conducted and Evaluation process. The members were intimated about the Evaluation pattern of 60-40 after receiving the Autonomy status.
- > Agenda No. 4.10: To seek approval for the Policy for Persons with Disability (PWD) students and special provision made for *Divyang* students for Internal Examination.

The Academic Council was informed by Prin. Dr.Suchitra Naik that the number of Special children (*Divyang* students) taking admission in different programmes has increased manifold. The college has initiated the Atulya Cell which caters to the varying needs of the Special children. Two teachers are exclusively designated as incharge especially for the 58 visually challenged students. Braille notifications in the campus, huge collection of books in Braille are some of the facilities provided to visually challenged learners. It was pointed out to the honourable members that it has been a concern to provide writers for these students especially for Internal exams, hence it was decided to make special provision to change the mode of Internal exam and evaluation that would suit the *Divyang* students. The members greatly appreciated the efforts of the college in catering to the needs of Special learners.

#### Resolution No.6

RESOLVED that the Academic Council unanimously approves the Policy for Persons with Disability (PWD) students and special provision made for *Divyang* students for Internal Examination.
